"Learn to do good; seek justice, rescue the oppressed, defend the orphan, plead for the widow." Isaiah 1:17



What does poverty look like here?

One of the questions to ask in order to support the development of missionary communities is, 'what does poverty look like here?' Knowing this enables informed actions to be taken to reach out to those in need in our wider communities. To help, Caritas has been analysing key areas of need within the diocese, including poverty and financial insecurity, housing and homelessness, ageing population, loneliness, domestic abuse, migrants and refugees and modern slavery. Each section looks at the issues at the national, diocesan and local level, and is accompanied by suggested ways to help. This information has been distributed to all parishes to help guide social action activity in the area. A prayer leaflet has also been put together to accompany the pack. Social Action and the Jubilee Year

The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales have identified 6 social action issues that are challenging us to live the Jubilee in our parishes including Food Poverty, Debt, Modern Slavery, Care for Our Common Home, Forgiveness and Rest. They have put together a <u>reflection guide</u> which is ideal to use in your parish or Jubilee small group.



Two-Child Benefit Cap

As part of their campaign to get the two-child benefit cap lifted, the <u>Caritas Social Action Network</u>, is conducting this survey to assess the impact of the two-child benefit cap and the broader effects of the current economic climate on Catholic families in England and Wales.

The insights gathered from this survey will play a crucial role in the advocacy efforts to address child poverty and influence policy change. Attending the CSAN Parliamentary Reception

In February, Caritas had the opportunity to visit the House of Commons along with the other 50 members of the Caritas Social Action Network. We had been invited to attend a Parliamentary Reception hosted by MP, Mike Kane, to highlight the breadth and depth of Catholic charitable action across the country. A few MP's popped in, including from our diocese. With over £484 million being spent on supporting the common good, the Church has a huge impact across the country.

It was also an opportunity to engage with MP's on key issues including:

- 1. The ending of the harmful Two-Child Benefit Cap, which is pushing families into deeper poverty.
- 2. Opposing the Assisted Dying Bill, advocating for dignity in end-of-life care rather than legislation that undermines the value of life.

10 Year Anniversary of Laudato Si'

This May is the 10-year anniversary of the publication of the Encyclical letter 'Laudato Si' by Pope Francis. In his letter to humanity, reminding us that caring for our common home is part of our role as Christians, and that the over consumption of the rich, has on the greatest impact on the poor.

This anniversary falls as it is reported that January 2025 was the hottest on record, with an average global temperature of 13.23 degrees. This is 0.79C above the 1991-2020 average and 1.75C higher than the preindustrial level. It is also the 18th month in the last 19, that saw the global average surface air temperature more than 1.5C above preindustrial levels.

In this Year of Jubilee, there is still so much we can do to hope for a brighter future for generations to come. In the follow up document, 'Laudate Deum', Pope Francis recognises that change has to happen at international level, but that this is driven by cultural change from local level. This is the change we are called to make. We need to "live simply, so others might simply live".

On Saturday 10th May, CAFOD and Caritas are holding a joint event that will be packed with practical information of how we can make a difference in our lives and that of our parish. There will be and opportunity to:

- Listen to talks from parishes working towards or have completed the CAFOD's Live Simply Award.
- Take part in the Let us Dream activity from Journey to 2030.
- Talk to the Diocese Estates team about how your parish might become more energy efficient along with case studies from other churches.
- Take back lots of ideas and resources to help make changes in you life and to help your parish celebrate Laudato Si' week later in the month.

Ambassador Programme

Human Trafficking & Modern Slavery (HTMS) is the second largest profitable crime and is steadily growing. It impacts every country and targets victims of all ages and backgrounds. HTMS is often regarded as a hidden crime as it is difficult to collect data on victims and enterprises, but we can all do our part to ensure our communities are safeguarded. Caritas Social Action Network are launching a HTMS Ambassador Programme through which we can all become more aware off the issue and how to identify it happening in our communities but also to collaborate with other charities and local agencies to help combat HTMS in our Communities.
